Students will use graphic organizers, models, and other devices for extra support.
- **Social Studies Strategies:** Implement Unpacking of Curriculum Standards in Social Studies. Intensive PL on research-based instructional practices (Explicit Instructional Model) and new curriculum materials. Increase practice with writing constructed and extended constructed response questions. Students will use Gallopade books, maps, PowerPoint lessons, and guided notes.
- Parent and Family Engagement Strategies: Providing opportunities for regular meetings, if requested by parents, to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their children, and respond to any such suggestions within a reasonable timeframe. Building Capacity

The CLIP is a document developed by the schools and district and then approved by the Georgia Department of Education. It serves as a blueprint for guiding the school's continuous improvement and progress towards identified school and district achievement objectives and targets.

2.1 Coherent Instructional System

2.2 Effective Leadership
